The awards will be presented in a special ceremony at the NSPS Board of Governors meeting during the 2008 American Congress on Surveying and Mapping (ACSM) annual conference in Spokane, Washington. A past president of NSPS, Richard Lomax was the driving force behind the elevation of the local Trig-Star program to the national level. In October 1994, Board action named this high school trigonometry skill award in his honor.

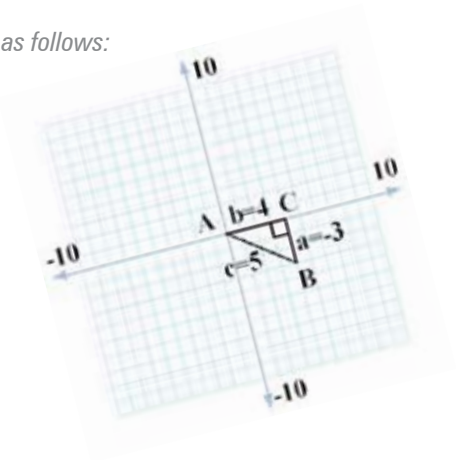
